QS Sustainability Rankings

Measures Environmental Impact (45%), Social Impact (45%), and Governance (10%) across 1,397 institutions. Focuses on research, education, and equity.



THE Impact Rankings

Covers 18 SDGs. Evaluates universities on 4 key metrics: research, stewardship, outreach, and teaching. In 2024, over 1,500 universities participated.



UI GreenMetric

Assesses six main criteria: Setting & Infrastructure (15%), Energy & Climate Change (21%), Waste (18%), Water (10%), Transportation (18%), and Education (18%). Involves over 1,000 universities worldwide.
